Kathy joined VNS Health in 2014 and since then has led research efforts that promote the delivery of high-quality, costeffective health care in the home and community. These efforts also help policymakers, elected officials, clinicians, providers, product teams, and more make data-driven decisions on home- and community-based services.

of Nursing at University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing with an over 20-year career in research. She is recognized throughout the world for achievements in decision science and telehealth. She has worked with several organizations and committees such as the National Quality Forum Care Coordination Steering Committee, The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, and Heath Information Technology Standards Panel (HITSP) Care Coordination Committee.
