Violet\* always had a passion for helping others. As the matriarch of a family of 10 children, she spent her life caring for her loved ones. For most of her life, she lived in Jamaica, where she was known for being the one to help those in need.

But when COVID struck, it was finally time for the 87-year-old to let someone help her instead.

### Losing - and Regaining - Her

#### **Mobility**

Violet's daughter Denise watched in distress as her mother withered under the strain of the pandemic lockdowns and struggled with weak vision. Seeing her mother become essentially immobile, Denise set out to get her mother the help she needed.

That's when Denise turned to VNS Health. Through the organization's charitable care program, Violet began receiving services to get her back on her feet.

VNS Health physical therapist Bernard worked with Violet to help her regain her strength and mobility. She practiced walking with a cane, and he helped her learn how to navigate the stairs to the second floor of her home. These were important steps toward restoring her independence.
