To date, the Center has been awarded over \$60 million in federal and private grant and contract funding, evolving into a multi-functional scientific research and evaluation team informing VNS Health, local, national, & international health policy, science & evidence-based practice.

12 new proposals submitted in 2024 (9 federal), total of \$12,916,727 in requested funding

- **4** proposals awarded funding (2 of which were 2023 submissions; 3 Federal awards); total value of \$441,024 (profiles below)
